




Last term in: Year 4

Year 4 had a fun-filled Term 1. Lots of our learning was linked to our topic, Rivers. We read texts linked to water and listened to water-themed songs and clapped matching rhythms. To complement this, we had a super visit from Bristol Avon Rivers Trust who discussed local rivers and showed us how to build a river friendly house out of Lego. Great fun!



In English, we wrote descriptive paragraphs about Mr and Mrs Twit. We used ambitious vocabulary to describe their appearance, personality and hobbies. Matteo described Mrs Twit as 'an ugly-looking woman with dry and scabby skin' and her evil smile was followed by a 'rude cackle'. In addition to this, he described her personality as 'thoughtless and mean'.



We've enjoyed creating collages using wrappers, stencils, tissue paper and pom-poms in Art. Our final composition required all of our Westfield creativity to ensure our artwork had a focal point and was balanced.




This Week in: Year 1/2

This week, year 1 and 2 have taken their learning outside. The children began with a scavenger hunt around the school grounds, spotting and collecting interesting natural treasures. They then became scientists, investigating which materials would make the best pond liner and discovering what makes some materials more waterproof than others. Using natural objects, they also practised their maths skills in creative ways.

To finish the morning, the children listened to an autumn poem and worked together to piece it back together line by line from cut-up strips. They then came up with their own autumn adjectives to describe what they could see, hear, and feel outdoors, writing their words on leaves to enhance the poem. Finally, they created beautiful autumn wreaths using real leaves and twigs.

It was a fantastic morning of exploration, creativity, and hands-on learning!

They have also been working on writing instructions to stay safe with fireworks and fabulous list poems inspired by bonfire night.
